Community and school sessions postponed

The health and safety of our local community, fans, participants, players and staff remains our top priority at this challenging time.

In response to the coronavirus outbreak and the latest government advice, we've made the decision to postpone all community and school sessions delivered by Red Neighbours and our charity, LFC Foundation until further notice.

It's during difficult times that we are reminded how important it is to stay connected and support each other in any way that we can, so despite the postponement of our physical regular community and school activities, we remain dedicated and committed to serving our fans and our local community. Some of our newly adapted community activity will include:

- Red Neighbours will deliver online chair-based yoga sessions for over 50s
- LFC Foundation staff will deliver online physical activity and mindfulness sessions for people to access at home to encourage physical and mental health
- LFC Connect – a new initiative which contacts (via telephone) vulnerable people living in isolation in Anfield and the surrounding areas. The calls will be supported by LFC, Red Neighbours and LFC Foundation staff
- LFC, Red Neighbours and LFC Foundation will continue to support foodbanks in Liverpool and Merseyside

We are also working with Liverpool City Council to explore where we can assist them and other service providers in the city region-wide community response. We will continue to do all in our power to harness the strength of our fans and support our local community and those who need our help.

We are taking the latest advice from the government and we will continue to do our best to keep you updated and connected. We want our LFC family to know that social distancing and isolation doesn't mean you're on your own – **'You'll Never Walk Alone'.**

LFC Supports North Liverpool Foodbank



Liverpool FC has made a £40,000 donation to Fans Supporting Foodbanks following the postponement of Premier League fixtures due to the coronavirus outbreak.

Representatives from Red Neighbours and LFC Foundation visited St Andrew's Community Network to show the club's continued support for the initiative and stand together with the local community during uncertain times.

For the past three years, the club's community programme, Red Neighbours, has backed Fans Supporting Foodbanks' matchday collections – helping North Liverpool Foodbank to assist local people living in food poverty.

During the suspension of the Premier League, the cancellation of matches threatens a significant impact on North Liverpool Foodbank, which receives approximately 25 per cent of its donations from matchday collections at Anfield and Goodison Park.

Forbes Duff, Red Neighbours manager, said: "We have a long-standing relationship with Fans Supporting Foodbanks and the North Liverpool Foodbank, and we want to make sure that the local people continue to get the help they need.

"We're doing whatever we can to offer support – including campaigns to raise awareness, and also looking at how we can really impact the local Anfield area and the wider city as we go into some uncertain times."

The Reds first-team squad and LFC Foundation committed to jointly donating £10,000 per game for this season's four remaining league fixtures scheduled to be played at Anfield – ensuring the foodbank can continue to function without the matchday collections.

An online fundraising page has been created as an alternative to allow supporters to make a financial donation directly to North Liverpool Foodbank - <https://donorbox.org/fanssupportingfoodbanks>

Donations can also be made to LFC's Emergency Foodbank Appeal via LFC's and LFC Foundation's official Facebook pages. The appeal, which is administered by the LFC Foundation, will donate 100% of the funds raised directly to the Trussell Trust, which supports a network of foodbanks in Liverpool and Merseyside.

Matt Parish, LFC Foundation director, said: "With 25 per cent of North Liverpool Foodbank's donations coming from the collections at Liverpool and Everton home games, we realised there would be a gap there and felt it was important that we step in to help."

Dave Kelly, chairman of Fans Supporting Foodbanks, said: "Things like this transcend football. We got together on Saturday afternoon with the idea of trying to raise £10,000 to fill the void, and to be here a little over 48 hours later with £50,000 of donations is the biggest testimony to this city.

"It's incredible what they have done. Fair play to all the players, staff and supporters – the help and the assistance they've given us is absolutely amazing."

Priority items for North Liverpool Foodbank include:

UHT milk	Instant mash
Long-life juice or cordial	Rice pudding/custard
Coffee	Jam
Jar pasta/curry sauce	Toiletries
Tinned meat	Cup-a-soup/noodles
Tinned vegetables	Washing tablets

All items and contributions will be donated to North Liverpool Foodbank and made into three-day emergency food parcels for local people in crisis in the area, including the club's surrounding postcodes L4, L5 and L6.

- 5) Which two Liverpool players appeared in BBC show 'Boys from the Blackstuff'?

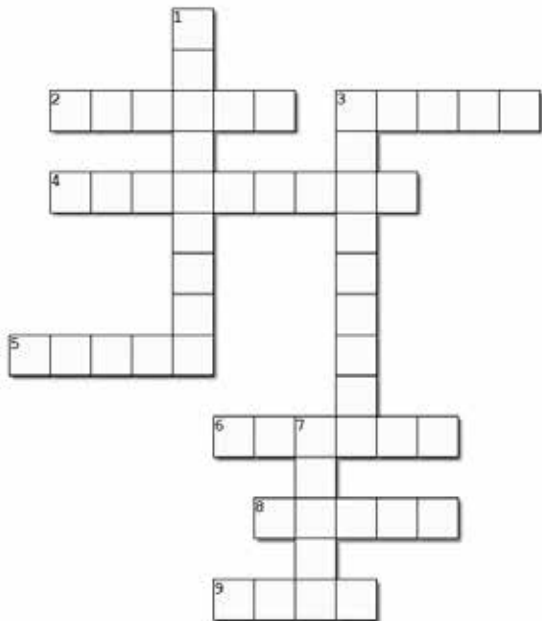
